The Equine prevet program is simply a preet program with additional large animal experience. Going through the EPRE major doesn't reflect what species you'd like to focus on as a career, but ratpeovides a variety of unique hands veterinary related experiences.

Honestly, from an objective standpoint, having been through veterinary school myself, I encourage anyone interested in veterinary medicine to go through the Equive Pre major for the following reasons.

- It is not limiting at all. If anything, you have a significantly increased number of large animal hands on experience, which is mandatory for vet school application. We assist you in organizing internships in a variety of speciesluiding small animal, food animal, Equine, exotics, etc.

-The amount of hands veterinary medical experience you receive through the major is exceptional. From learning complete physical exams, neurological examinations, lameness examinations, venipurret intramuscular injection ophthalmic exams, etc. to cadaver dissection op are immersed in an intensive experiential program where the skills you learn will transfer across species u will be ahead of your classmates in veterinary school when it cores to dissection and applications, as you will have done those things inour undergraduate program, where receives of your classmates will be learning those techniques for the first time.

-You will learn proper and safe large animal handling skills. In **ineter** school, a common complaint from clinical faculty is the lack of large animal handling skills of the majority of veterinary students. The skills you learn in the Equinevermajor will build a solid foundation for you to handle all large animalsluiding horses, cows, llamas, etcall of which you will be exposed to in veterinary school.

-Our Systems courses focus on physiology and pathophysiology of various veterinary disease processes in the horse, transfer across a variety of species which is again applicable throughout veterinary school.
