Equine-Assisted Activities and Therapies Minor Equine Science Department

Equine-assisted activities and therapies involve the use of horses to benefit individuals with disabilities or mental health issues. This minor will provide both dassroom content and hands-on activities, with a primary focus on therapeutic riding and equine-assisted psychotherapy.

Students will develop a working knowledge of Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship (PATH) International and Equine Assisted Growth and Learning Association (EAGALA) methodology and standards. This minor may be paired with a major in Equine Business Management, Allied Health, Psychology, Early Childhood Education, Educational Studies, or other majors, depending on individual career goals and interests.

Course Requirements

EQSC 1100, 1110, 2400, 2900, and 3410 are required for the minor. You may choose between EQSC 3200 or MGMT 3555. You may also choose from any equine experiential course within the EQSC 1400 series.
