Students must earn a C or higher in all prerequisite and major course work for the Art Major (BA) at Otterbein. Classes denoted by the double asterisk are prerequisite/major courses for the Art Major (BA). Students are encouraged to meet with an Otterbein advisor regarding their major course work and general education course work meant to satisfy Otterbein's general education or INST requirement. Students must complete THREE Writing Intensive (WI) courses to graduate from Otterbein. Columbus State's Composition I course and Otterbein's ART 3000: Junior Seminar are two of the three WI courses needed for
